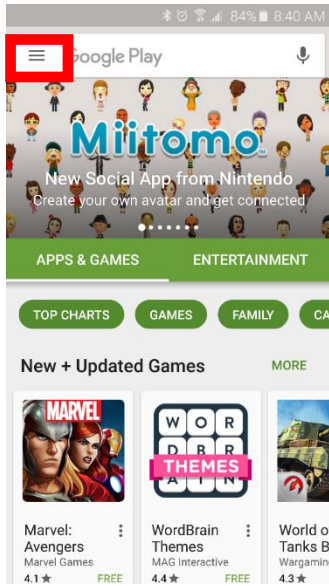
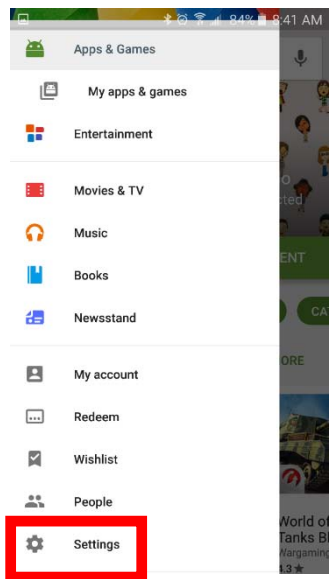


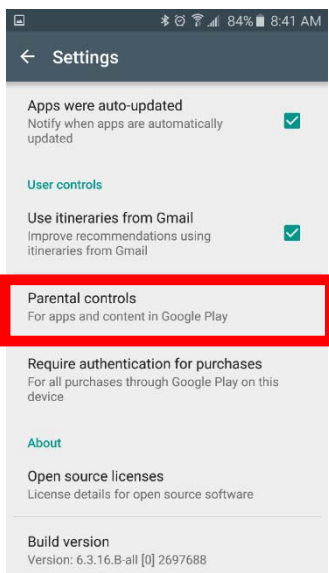
Setting up Android Parental Controls



1. Open "Play Store" application and tap on the menu icon (top left hand icon).

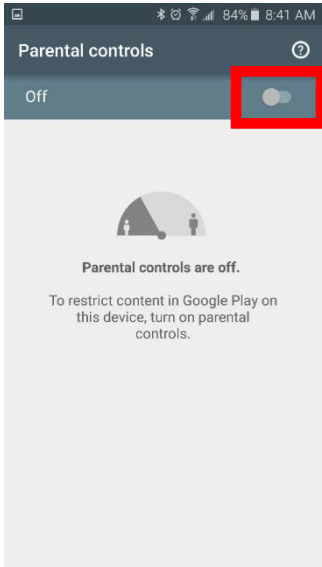


2. Tap Settings.

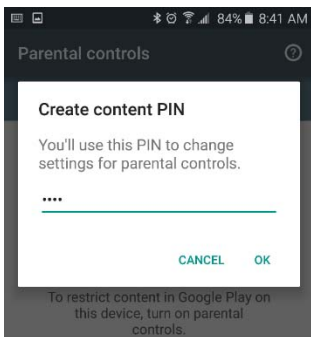


3. Tap Parental Controls.

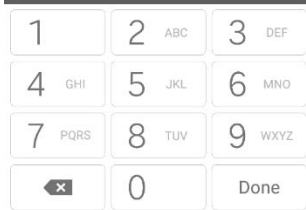

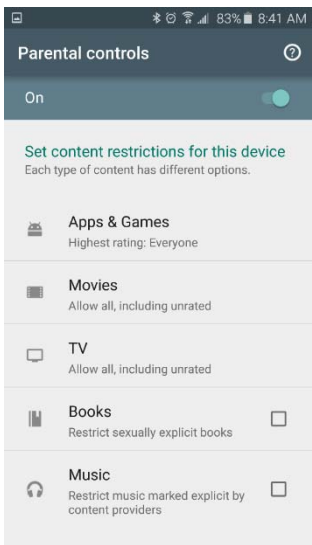
4. Parental Controls will default to “off”. To enable parental controls, slide the button on the right hand side.



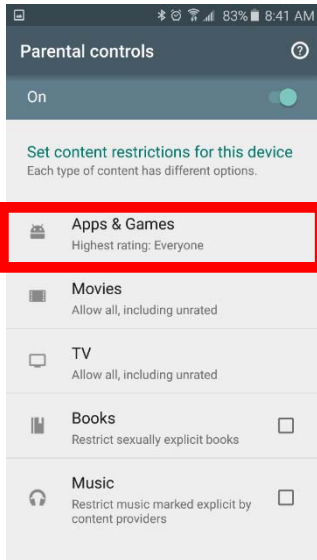
5. Create a PIN. Use this PIN to change settings for parental controls in the future.



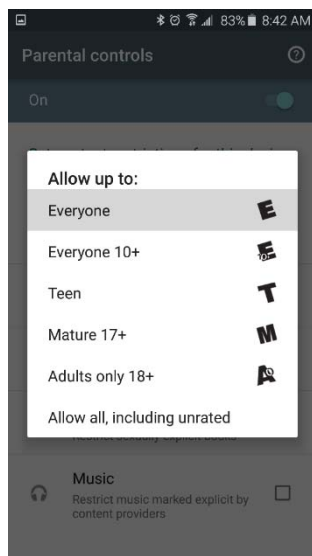
6. This screen will show all available options for content restriction. Click on Apps & Games, Movies or TV to see additional options. Check the box next to Books and Music to restrict explicit material.



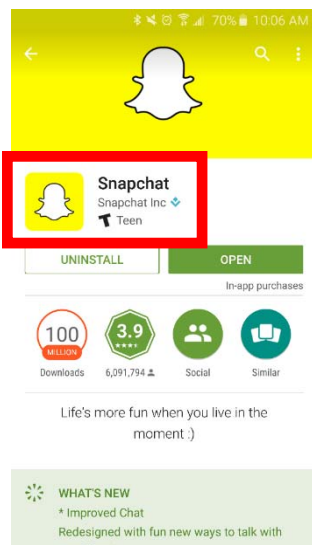

7. Tap on Apps & Games to set up rating restrictions for items that can be downloaded from the Google Play store.



8. The default setting is to allow all content to be viewed and downloaded from the Google Play store. Select one of the options to restrict what content can be viewed and downloaded. To figure out what each app is rated as, see "Step 9."



9. To see what rating an app has: Click on an app and look under the app name. There will be a rating of Everyone (E), Everyone 10+ (E10), Teen (T), Mature 17+(M) or Adults only 18+ (A).
 - a. In this case, in order to restrict the viewing and downloading of this app, choose the Everyone 10+ option from "Step 8."
 - b. Setting up restrictions based on content rating only applies to apps that are not currently on the device.
